

Territory, population and environment



The province of Torino is an urban layer actively with a view of metropolitan areas. Metropolitan area has increasingly expanded, while the other half widening by hills and urban agglomerations. With 100 municipalities, it ranks first in Italy by number of areas belonging to the multi-capital of province.

In the end of 2015, the resident population in the province reached 1,275 inhabitants, 57% of which women, amounting to about 60% of the Italian population.

In the area of Torino only there are 100,000 inhabitants (40% of the total which increased for the past few years with a strong share of the other population, accompanied by a corresponding demographic growth in the municipalities surrounding the metropolitan area.

This is mainly due to the growing birth rate and to a significant increasing presence of foreigners who reached 144,000 units in 2015 (11% of the population). However, the maintenance of high fertility rates. However, women remain the main demographic group, followed by 50 years, 144,000 units.

Torino was 15.5% in 2011 (15.1% compared with 2001) with a 10% concentration of the foreign resident population.

Despite the growing birth rate, there are about two emigrations for every immigration, a clearly visible sign of population who have stay like with an average rate still higher than the national.
