VITA FORTUNATI is Full Professor of English Literature at the Faculty of Foreign Languages and Literatures of the University of Bologna. He has been Dean of the Faculty of Foreign Languages and Literatures (1995-1998) and Vice-Director of the Associazione Italiana di Anglistica (Association of English Studies in Italy, 1994-1998). She is member of the Scientific Committee of the PhD programs in English Literature at the Universities of Firenze, Bologna and Pisa, and also Co-ordinator of the PhD Course in Comparative Literature at the University of Bologna (1997-2001).
